Class 1	A handmade bouquet of flowers and foliage made from paper products
Class 2	A wooden bug box - not painted or treated Max size 25cm x 20cm (10″x8″)
Class 3	A Japanese theme cross-stitch item (pressed but unframed and unmounted)
Class 4	A soft toy - knitted or crocheted
Class 5	A handmade small evening bag and dance card - any craft
Class 6	A crocheted cloche hat
Class 7	A Champagne bottle constructed of Lego and made by an adult 18 years plus. Max height 50 cm (18″). Not from a kit.
Class 8	A handmade card using pressed flowers and/or leaves. Not from a kit.
Class 9	A 3D handmade card for any occasion. Not from a kit.
Class 10	A small felted item. Not from a kit.
Class 11	A 1920s style choker made of handmade lace. Not from a kit.
Class 12	A completed page from a colouring book for adults
Class 13	A candle or tealight holder - any craft
Class 14	A bookmark (Not made of lace). Not from a kit
Class 15	A metal sculpture made of recycled screws, nuts, bolts, etc. Max size 30cm x 30cm (12" x 12")
Class 16	A 1920's style flappers headband - any craft

NB All baked goods to be displayed on a plain white plate covered with clingfilm. If you would like the judge to give comments on your entry (not for public display), please ask for a coloured card when you deliver your entry on 18th September.

Class 17	A Victoria sandwich - 18cm to 20cm (7" to 8") with raspberry jam filling and dusted with caster sugar	
Class 18	4 decorated cup cakes	
Class 19	5 individual cherry scones (max 6cm (2½″) any round cutter)	
Class 20	A jar of jam or marmalade (any fruit)*	
Class 21	A jar of curd (any fruit)*	
Class 22	A jar of fruit chutney*	
Class 23	5 round chocolate chip shortbread biscuits	
Class 24	A wholemeal loaf	

Class 25 A lattice top treacle tart

* All jam, jelly, marmalade and chutney with wax disc and cellophane or plastic cover (no metal tops). Label on jar to specify date of making

- Class 47 3 stems of Dahlia in a vase (may be mixed colours/varieties)
- Class 48 3 stems of Michaelmas daisies (may be mixed colours)

FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

Class 49 A miniature arrangement of flowers/plant material in any container (no accessories) (max size strictly 15cm (6") in any direction)





PHOTOGRAPHY Each exhibitor restricted to 2 entries per Class

- Class 50 All dressed up
- Class 51 Fur and feathers
- Class 52 Parallel lines

Each photograph entered must be separate, **unframed** and mounted on card. Photographs including mounts must be no larger than 30cmx30cm (12"x12").

Unmounted photographs will not be accepted. Please add your name and the class number on the back of each entry and deliver to the Scout & Guide premises between 10am and 12 noon on day of the Show.

ART Each exhibitor restricted to 2 entries per Class

- Class 53 A themed piece: "Stormy weather" in single or mixed media
- Class 54 Water colours and/or pastels
- Class 55 Oils and/or Acrylic
- **Class 56** Any other medium such as line drawing, sketches, and other techniques

All signatures must be covered. All paintings and drawings must have a wire or string by which they can be hung. Hooks will be supplied.

Please add your name and the class number on the back of each entry and deliver to the Scout & Guide premises between 10am and 12 noon on day of the Show.

CREATIVE WRITING

Please note entries, together with a completed entry form, for classes 57 & 58 are required by 4pm on Monday 9th August 2021. Winners will be notified in advance and rosettes awarded on the day of the Show.

Entries should be typed in double line spacing and must be original work. Do not write your name on your entry.

- **Class 57** A poem inspired by a photograph (included with the entry)
- Class 58 A short story (max 1000 words). Title 'Every picture tells a story'. Inspired by a photograph included with the entry

ALLOTMENTS & FLOWER DISPLAYS

These classes are open to residents of Oakley, Deane, Malshanger or Newfound. All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor. Those in the Horticultural classes must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least 2 months before the Show.

One exhibitor (1 named person) per entry - submitted by 4pm on 2nd July 2021. Entry form on page 13. Judging to take place during the week of 12th July 2021. Winners will be notified and rosettes awarded on day of the Show.

- Class 73Best container (residential)
Residents only, not commercial. Please clearly identify your entry which
should be visable from the road
- Class 74 Best commercial container This class is for local businesses ONLY. Please clearly identify your entry
- Class 75 Oakley's Best Allotment -All Oakley allotments (at rear of Oakley Village Hall) will be judged (unless the owner opts out) - no entry fee this year for this class! Please ensure your plot number is clearly displayed

Criteria used by judges

- Visual aspect of the plot
- Good workmanship
- Quality of crops, flowers, fruit, vegetables and plants
- Originality of layout and planting
- Ingenuity in overcoming local problems/credit for composting/water conservation
- Condition of the plot
- Condition of structures, greenhouses, sheds if present and other accessories such as compost containers, cold frames, etc.

- **2.** Each exhibitor (ie 1 named person) is restricted to 1 entry per class, except Art and Photography which are restricted to 2 entries per exhibitor in each class.
- **3.** Please note that entries for writing classes 57 & 58, must be submitted by 4pm on Monday 9th August 2021. This is to give sufficient time for entries to be judged. See entry form for full details.
- **4.** Please note that entries for planted container classes 73 & 74, must be submitted by 4pm on Friday 2nd July 2021. See entry form for full details.
- Entry forms and fees (50p per entry) for classes 1 to 56; 76 to 84 to be delivered to the Scout & Guide premises in St John's Piece from 10am to 12 noon on Saturday 18th September.
- 6. All exhibits must be in position in the Scout & Guide premises, St John's Piece, no later than 12 noon on the morning of the show
- 7. All exhibitors must leave the hall by 12 noon.
- **8.** Judging will begin at 12 noon.
- **9.** All fruit, vegetable and flower entries (except class 49) must be grown by the exhibitor.
- **10.** All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor. Those in the Horticultural Classes must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least 2 months before the show.
- **11.** All exhibits to be clearly identified with a loose card showing the exhibitor's name. Cards to be placed under exhibit face down on the table.
- **12.** Exhibits for Art & Photography please print on the back of the exhibit your name and the class number entered.
- **13.** All entries for vegetables and fruit will be judged in accordance with the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook, 8th Edition, Revised 2016.
- **14.** No entries or exhibits to be removed before prize giving. Any fruit, vegetable or flower class items not collected by 4:30pm on Show day will be disposed of.
- **15.** No entry should have been exhibited previously in an Oakley Village Show.
- **16.** Entry to classes 1 to 56; 57 & 58 and 76 to 84 open to all ie not limited to village residents.
- **17.** Classes 73 to 74 are limited to residents and businesses in Oakley, Deane, Malshanger and Newfound.

As Show events in 2021 have been adapted due to Covid-19 guidelines, our income is much lower than usual. For this reason, we will continue to award children's prizes but give rosettes rather than tokens to all adult trophy winners. Trophies will be presented at 4:15pm on Saturday 18th September 2021.
